Advanced GI Panel Overview

The Advanced GI Panel is a robust multi-parameter blood panel, integrating 7 or more tests commonly used in the workup of GI disease in addition to 5 specialty test parameters unique to VDI. All our testing is performed with fully automated equipment achieving high levels of precision and accuracy.

The results of these tests, along with age, signalment, and context are then filtered through our proprietary AI to provide differential diagnosis for a range of the most common GI diseases seen in cats and dogs, all from that single blood draw.

VDI has a long history in using multi-marker panels as a method of improving overall sensitivity and specificity. Starting with the Neoplasia Index® using TK1 and CRP/HPT, VDI showed that sensitivity and specificity can be drastically improved when the power of data is employed. VDI has amplified that power by adding age, signalment, and context into the diagnostic AI to improve the overall performance of the laboratory test and their interpretation for the patient.

Working with VDI AGI Testing Specifics

Canine or Feline

Patients experiencing GI signs or undergoing therapy for GI disease.

Sample Requirements

Approximately 1.0-1.5 mL serum, separated into a non-additive tube. Stored & shipped frozen, or serum can be applied to a VDI dry serum test kit. Fasting recommended, but not required. Avoid hemolysis and lipemia.

Sending Samples to VDI

Frozen Serum

Samples can be shipped frozen to VDI using styrofoam containers with freezer packs. Samples should be shipped overnight (VDI can provide discounted shipping) except on Fridays or before holidays. Multiple samples can be shipped together. Contact VDI for more details.

Dry Serum

VDI offers a special test kit called a Dry Serum Test Kit (DSTK) that allows for ambient temperature transport. Contact VDI for specifics about ordering and shipping samples using the DSTK to help reduce costs and provide additional stability to your samples.

Receiving Results

VDI tests Monday thru Friday with reports typically within 24-48 hours of arrival at the lab. Results are uploaded to an online portal as well as emailed to the clinic. Sample reports available online.

Setting Up an Account

Setting up an account with VDI is easy. There are no formal contracts and no mininum testing is required. Simply submit samples as needed and pay the invoices when they come. To set up an account head to <u>www.vdilab.com</u> and click <u>Get Started</u>. Otherwise sending a sample to VDI using a VDI test requisition form establishes your account.
